4 Background.

The Longridge Loop is a five-mile accessible route for cyclists and walkers around Longridge, designed to enhance community recreation, promote sustainable transport, and boost tourism in the Ribble Valley. Initially proposed by Longridge Town Council in 2021, the project aimed to create a safe, scenic, and inclusive trail connecting key areas of the town and its surroundings.
